Dear Sir:

The American Hiking Society and the U.S. Department of Interior's Heritage Conservation and Recreation Service, as co-sponsors of the nationwide event called HikaNation, request permission to utilize a small area of the Oakland Army Base Parking Lot next to the West Grand Avenue Viaduct on Sunday morning, April 13, 1980.

On that morning, CalTrans, as directed by the Legislature of the State of California and with the approval of the Boards of Supervisors of San Francisco and Alameda Counties will close two lanes of the San Francisco-Oakland Bay Bridge to vehicular traffic. One lane will then be opened to hikers and the other lane reserved as a buffer against on-coming traffic. An estimated 10,000 to 15,000 opening weekend hikers are now expected to cross the Bridge as participants in the transcontinental 14 month long event ending in Washington, DC, in June, 1981.

An essential part of that Sunday hike will be the short stretch of Oakland Army Base property immediately beside the fence along Burma Road from CalTran's Gate 16 to the immediate area of A Street. This is the only feasible route from the CalTrans frontage road next to the Freeway over to the on and off-ramps of the West Grand Avenue Viaduct. It is in this general area that we are planning on utilizing AC Transit buses to shuttle the hikers over to BART's Oakland West Station for transportation back to their homes throughout the entire Bay Area. It is our thought to have the shuttle buses come through the Main Gate of the Oakland Army Base, drive through the empty parking lot to the immediate area of A Street where the passengers will be wait-

ing to board under the direction of an AC Transit official, then circle back to the Main Gate to the Oakland West BART Station. (AC Transit is discussing the idea of having the hikers board at the AC Transit stop next to the Cafeteria behind the main Headquarters group of buildings, but we feel this is unacceptable due to the distance involved and the ackward placement of that particular bus stop from our route of hike. Also, we would prefer being on as little Oakland Army Base property and as far away from the main buildings as possible.

It is our understanding that the U.S. Army will require insurance for the use of the property. We have placed a \$10,000,000 insurance bond with CalTrans in order to safeguard them with the Bridge. It would be a very simple matter to place the U.S. Army on that policy. We also have placed insurance policies with the Southern Pacific Railroad and the City and County of San Francisco.

We will have monitors trained in crowd control to guide the hikers on the entire walk from Golden Gate Park on Saturday, April 12, around the northern shoreline of San Francisco to the Bridge and then across to Oakland. These monitors will be members of the National Guard, the Daly City Police Department Explorer Post and the San Mateo County Sheriff's Department Explorer Post. We would also welcome Army MPs if you deem such additional security forces advisable. We are also taking care of litter along the entire line of walk by utilizing a number of the many Boy Scout and Girl Scouts Troops joining the hike.

To briefly describe the <u>HikaNation</u> and its goals: it is designed as a nationwide event calling attention to the fact that hiking and walking are healthy activities for the entire family, are non-polluting and non-energy consuming. The <u>HikaNation</u> also calls attention to the large numbers of <u>hikers in</u> the United States and the need for additional trails and walkways in urban areas as well as rural and wilderness areas. As part of this nationwide effort, the symbolic nature of the Bay Bridge itself, as well as the fact that the Bridge has never been walked by large numbers of people since it was opened in 1936 are seen to be cornerstones of the Opening Weekend and the National sections of the <u>HikaNation</u>.
